Upland Habitat Module

- What:** This is a 40-hour, Extension Program on Florida's ecosystems taught in three modules. The Uplands Module includes classroom instruction, field trips, and practical interpretive experience related to the general ecology, habitats, vegetation types, wildlife, and conservation issues of Upland Habitats in Florida. In addition, the program enhances naturalist interpretation skills and addresses environmental ethics issues.
- Who:** Adults interested in learning about the environment, including plants, animals, birds and invertebrates in the uplands habitat and teachers seeking environmental education contact hours. Appropriate for both novices and professionals in the field.
